Figure 1 Site Location - Map showing the Red Line Boundary of the Proposed Scheme

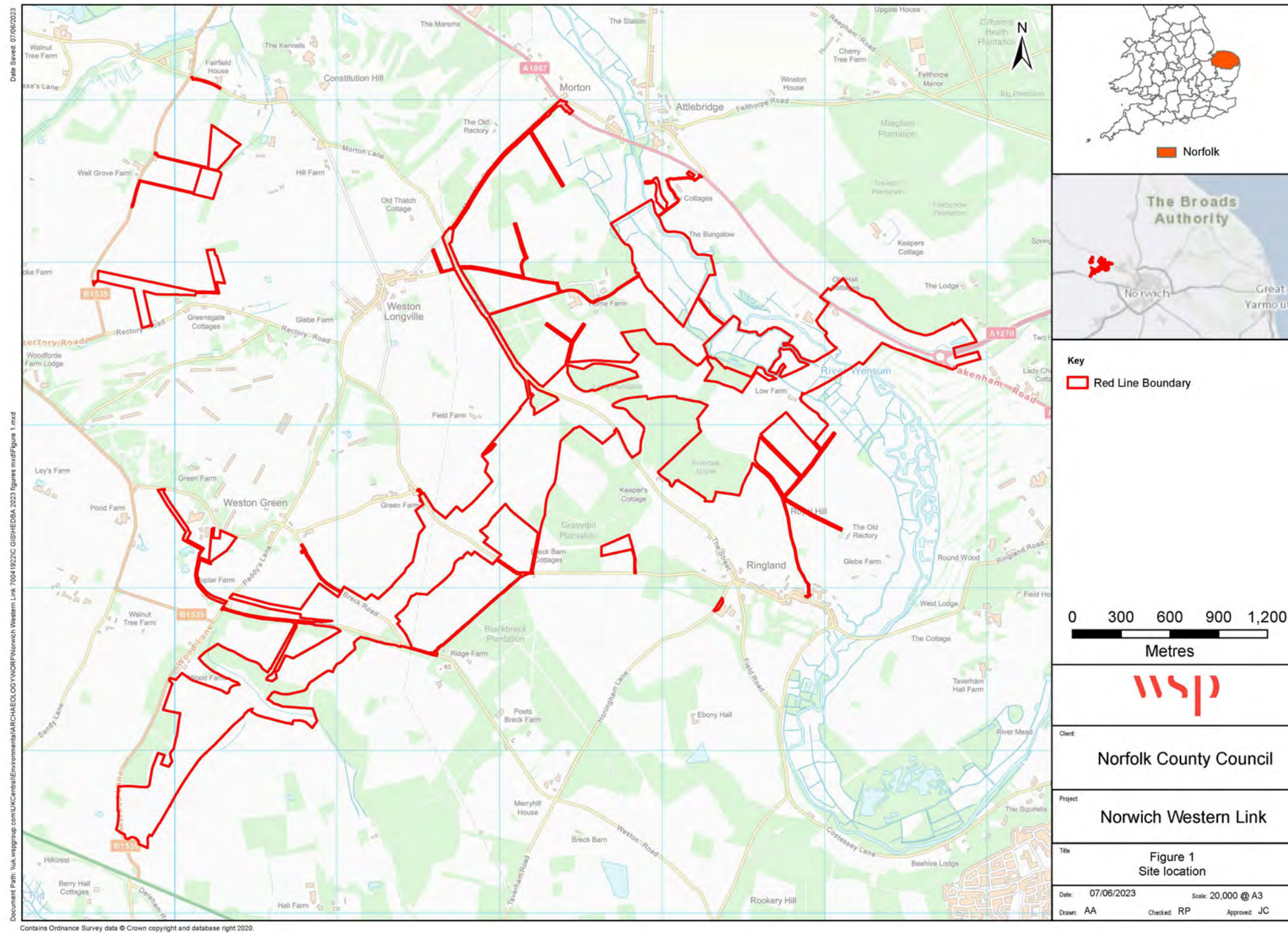


Figure 2 Historic environment features map – Showing designated heritage assets within 1km study area from the Red Line Boundary

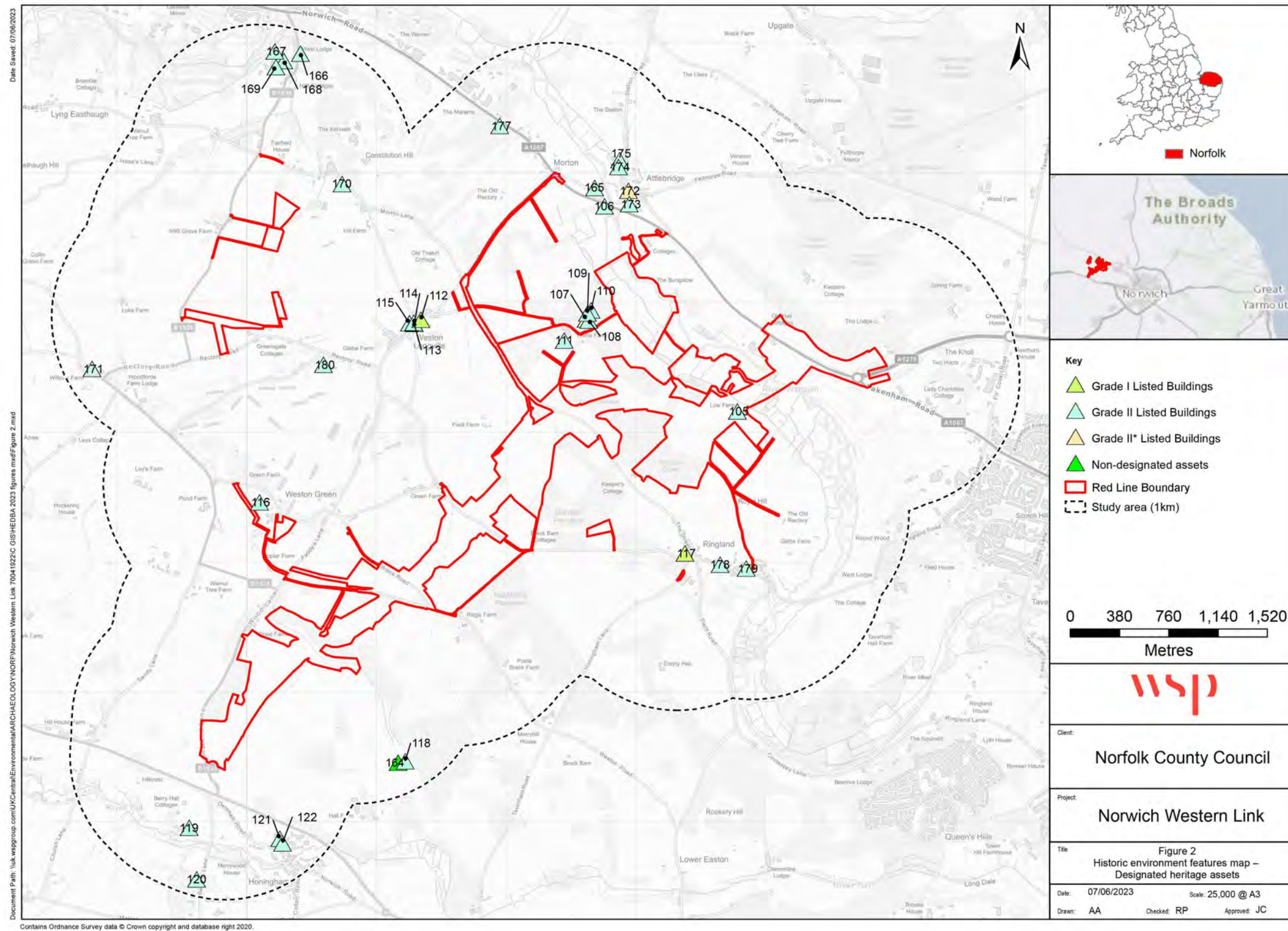


Figure 3a Historic environment features map – Showing non-designated heritage assets (North-east area) such as past archaeological investigations within 500m of study area from the Red Line Boundary on north-east part of the Proposed Scheme

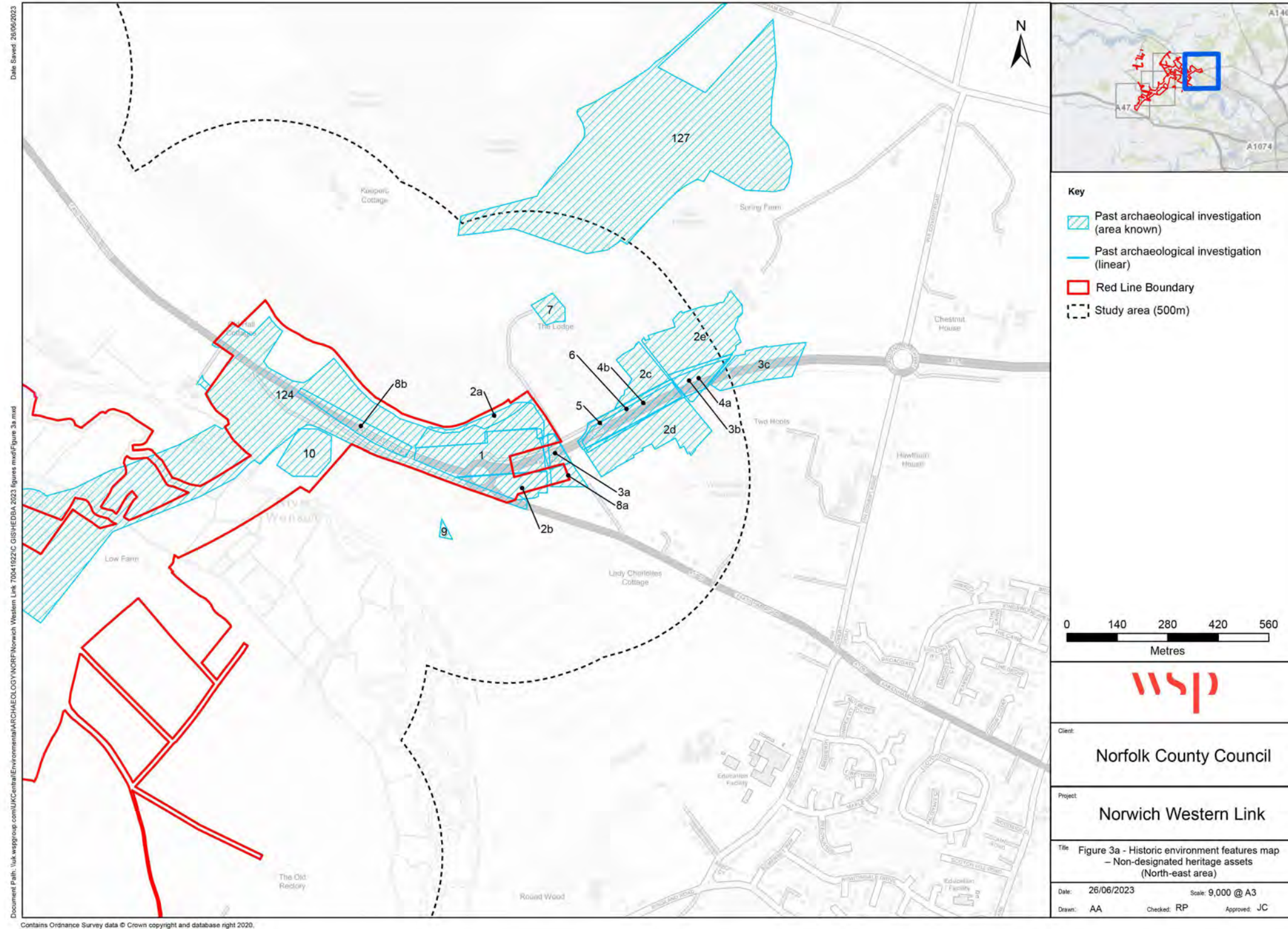


Figure 3b Historic environment features map – Showing non-designated heritage assets (North-east area) such as archaeological feature/findspot within 500m of study area from the Red Line Boundary on north-east part of the Proposed Scheme

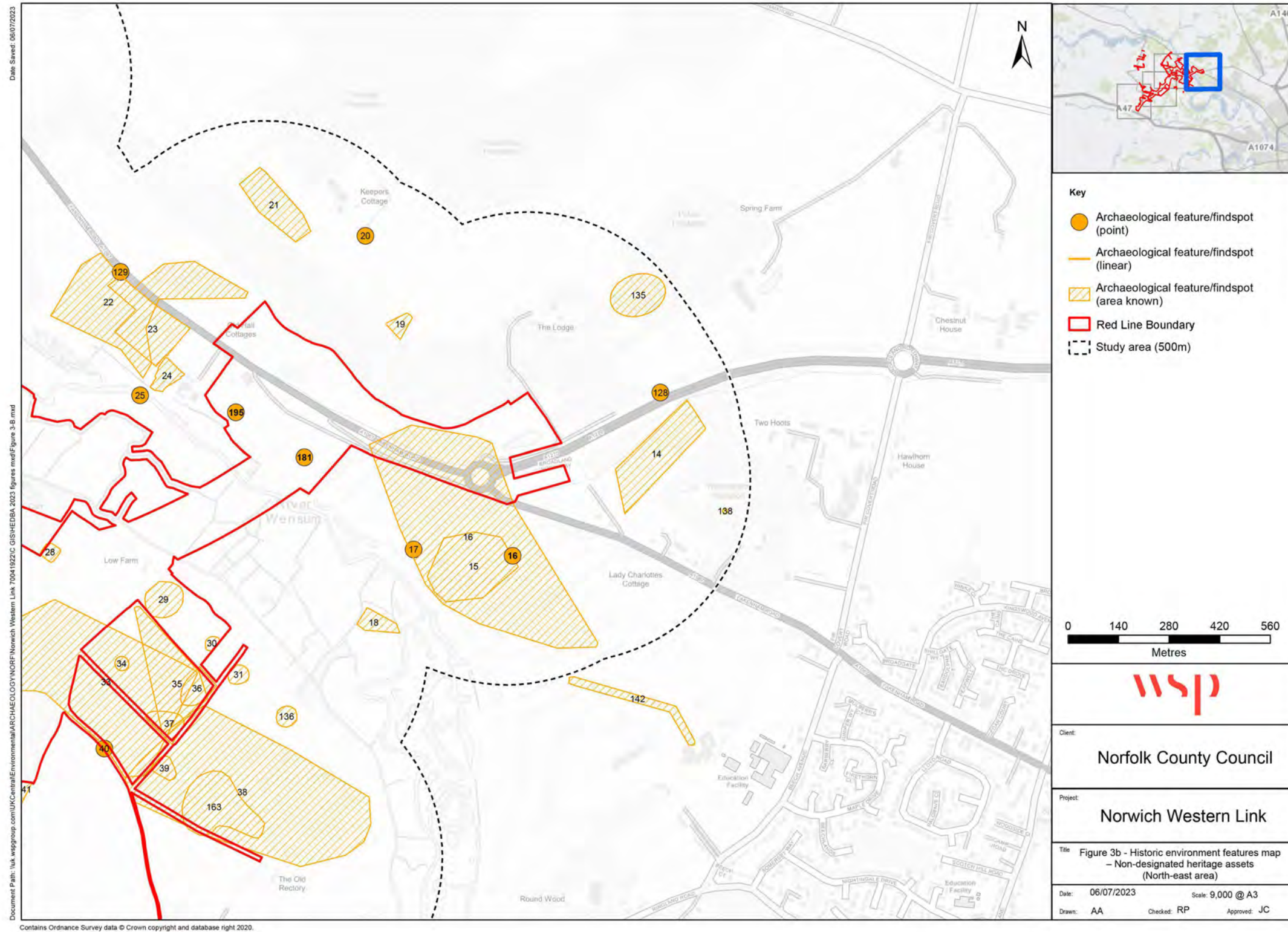


Figure 4a Historic environment features map – Showing non-designated heritage assets (North-central area) such as past archaeological investigations within 500m of study area from the Red Line Boundary on northern-central part of the Proposed Scheme

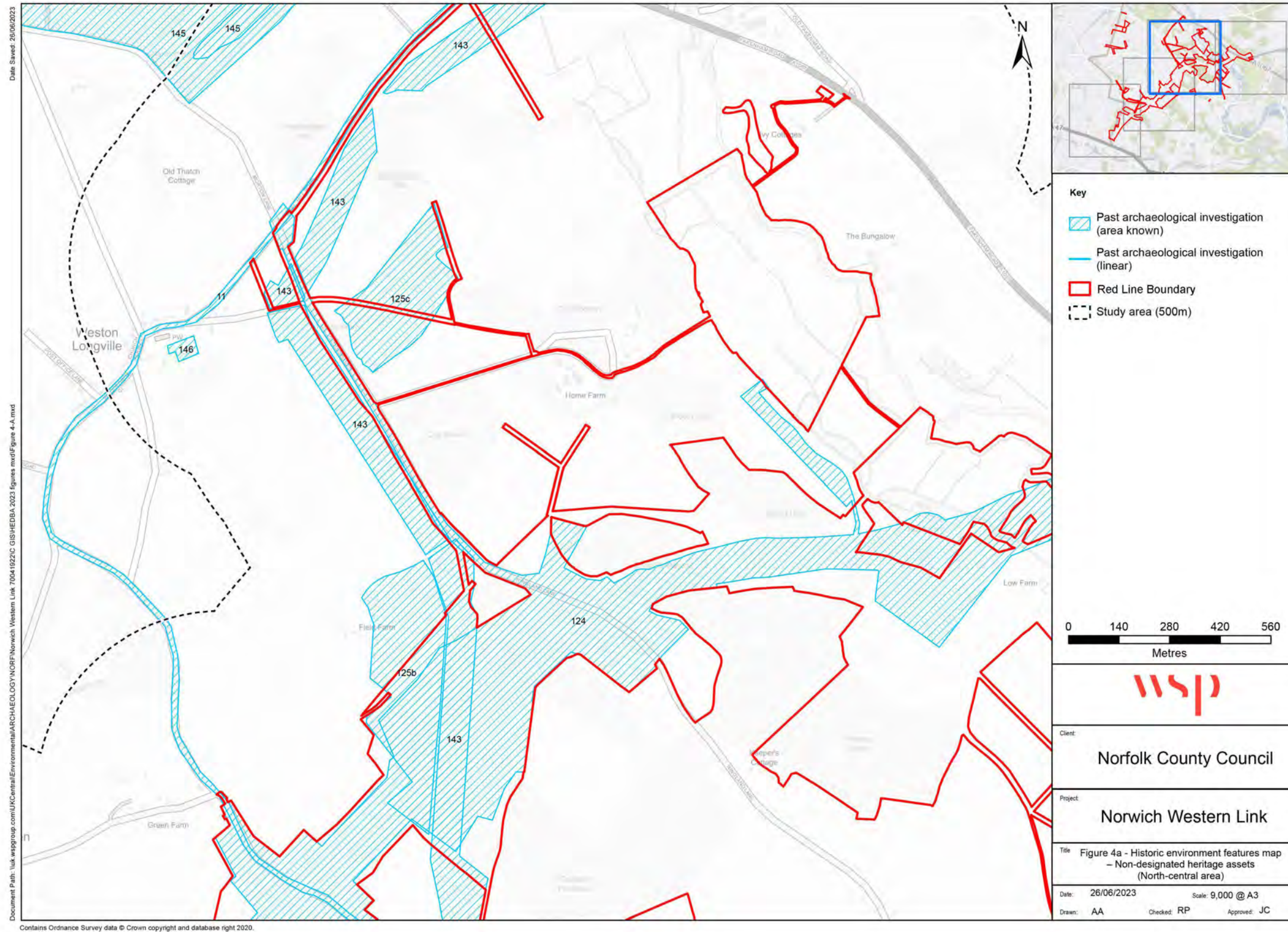


Figure 4b Historic environment features map – Showing non-designated heritage assets (North-central area) such as archaeological feature/findspot within 500m of study area from the Red Line Boundary on northern-central part of the Proposed Scheme

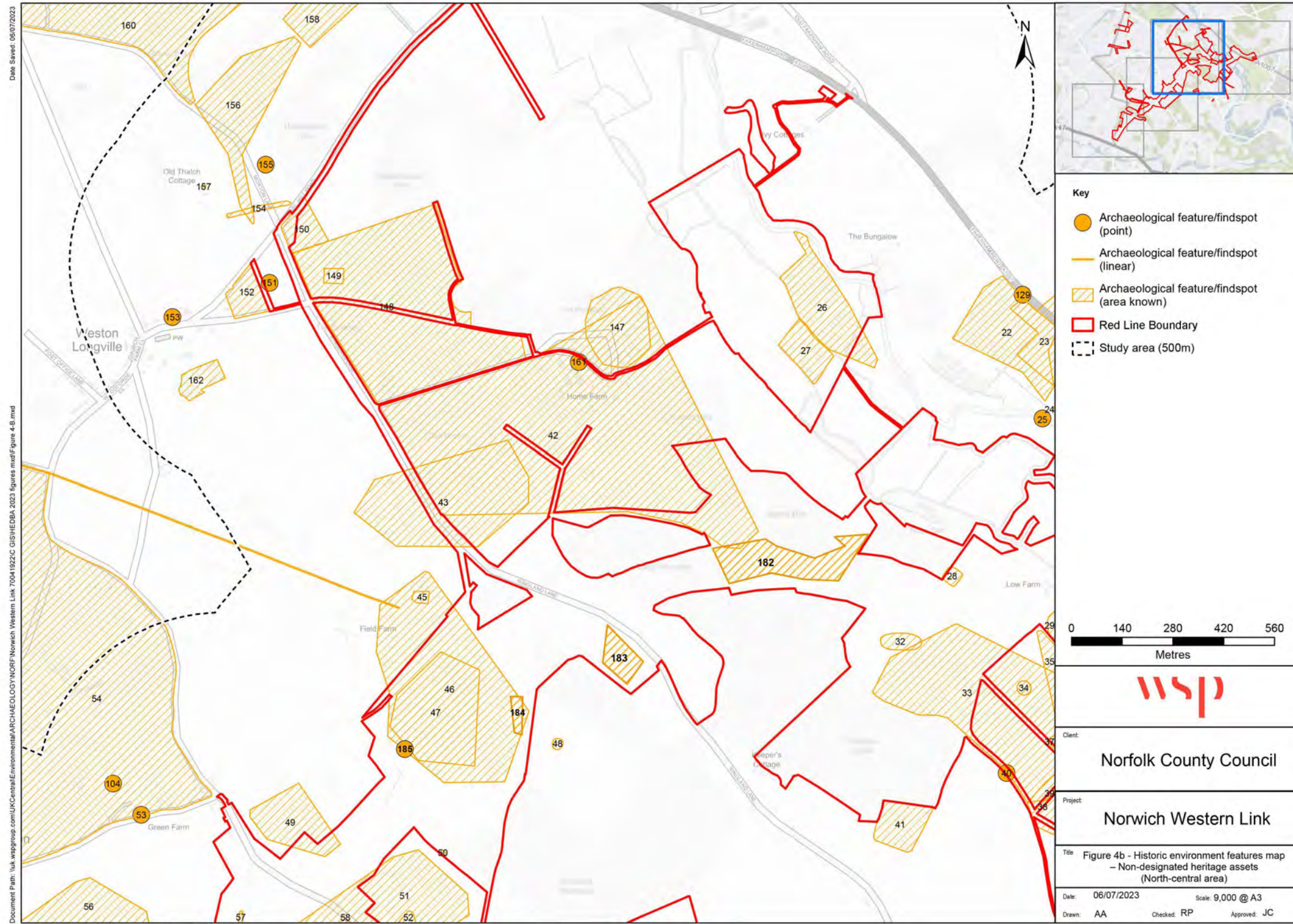


Figure 5a Historic environment features map – Showing non-designated heritage assets (South-central area) such as past archaeological investigations within 500m of study area from the Red Line boundary on southern-central part of the Proposed Scheme

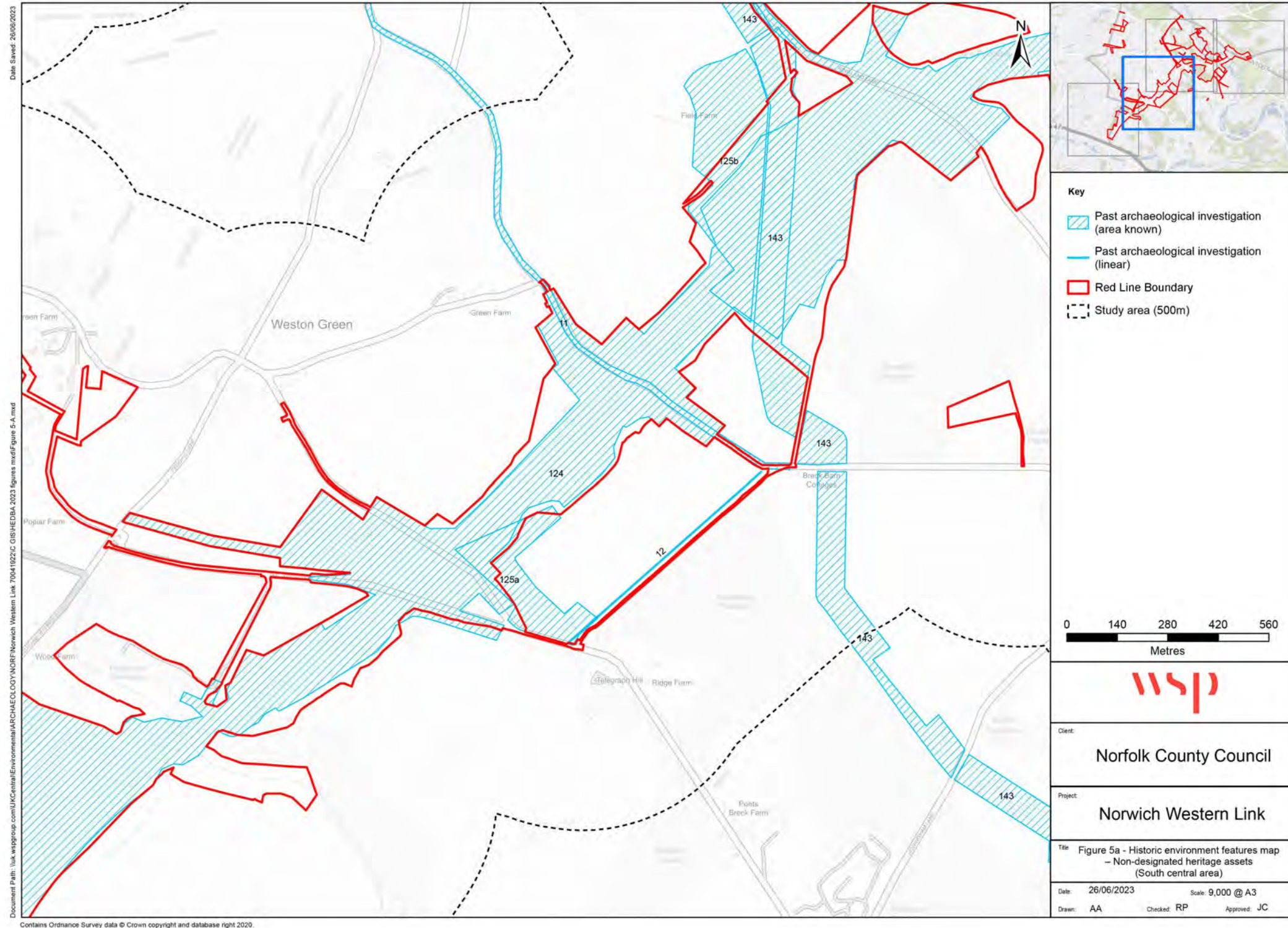


Figure 5b Historic environment features map – Showing non-designated heritage assets (South-central area) such as archaeological feature/findspot within 500m of study area from the Red Line boundary on southern-central part of the Proposed Scheme

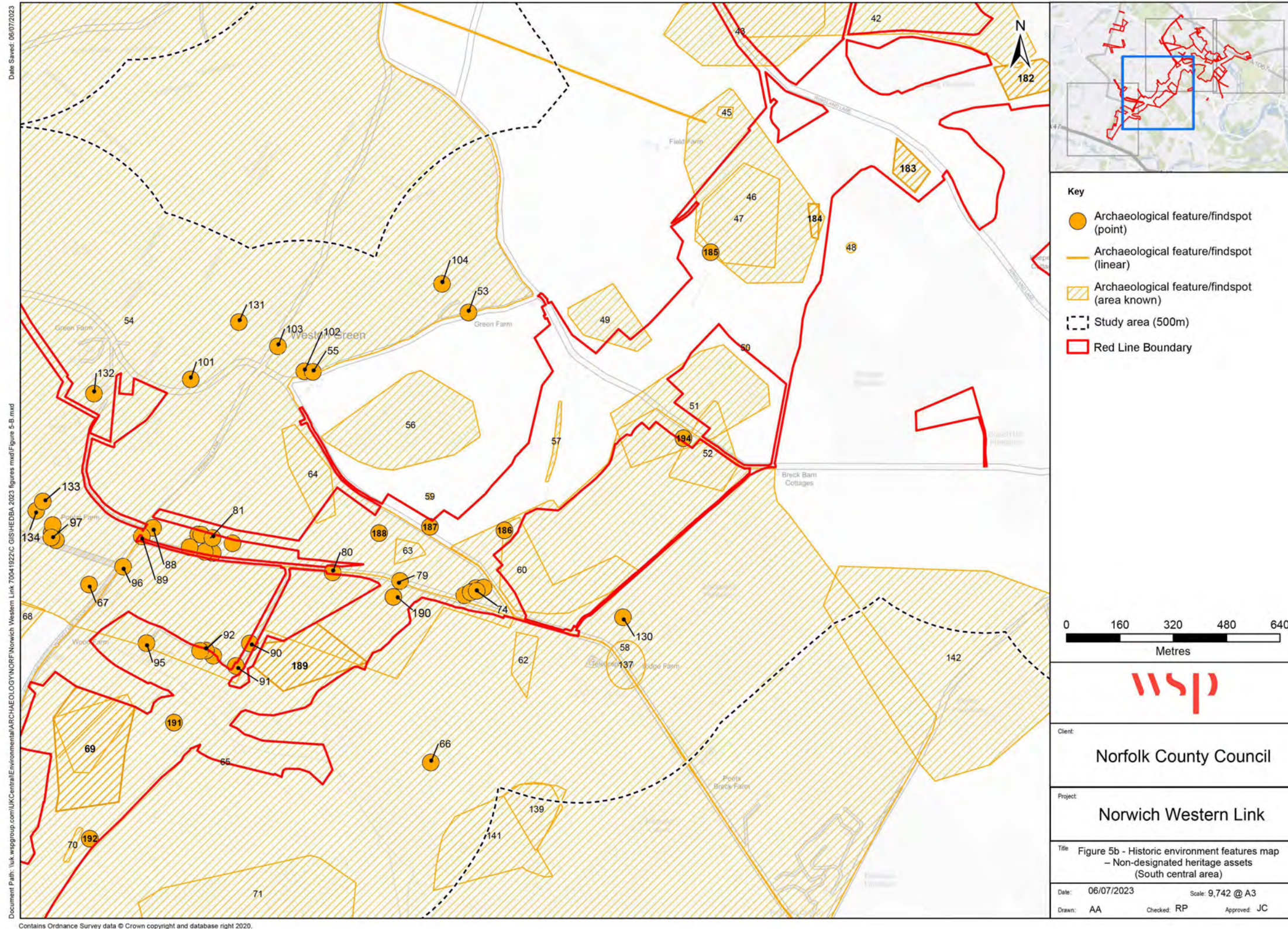


Figure 6a Historic environment features map – Showing non-designated heritage assets (South-west area) such as past archaeological investigations within 500m of study area from the Red Line Boundary on southern-west part of the Proposed Scheme

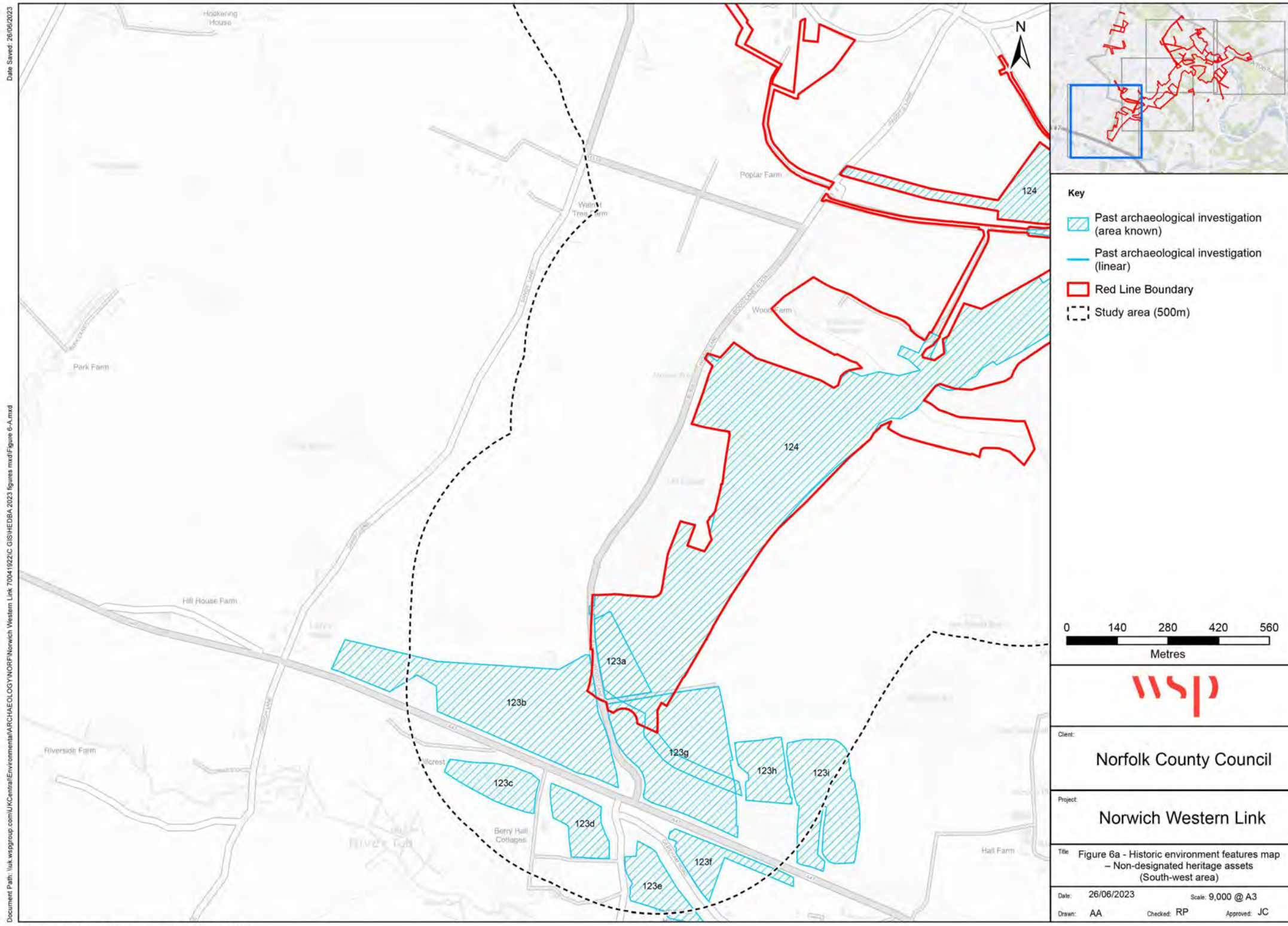


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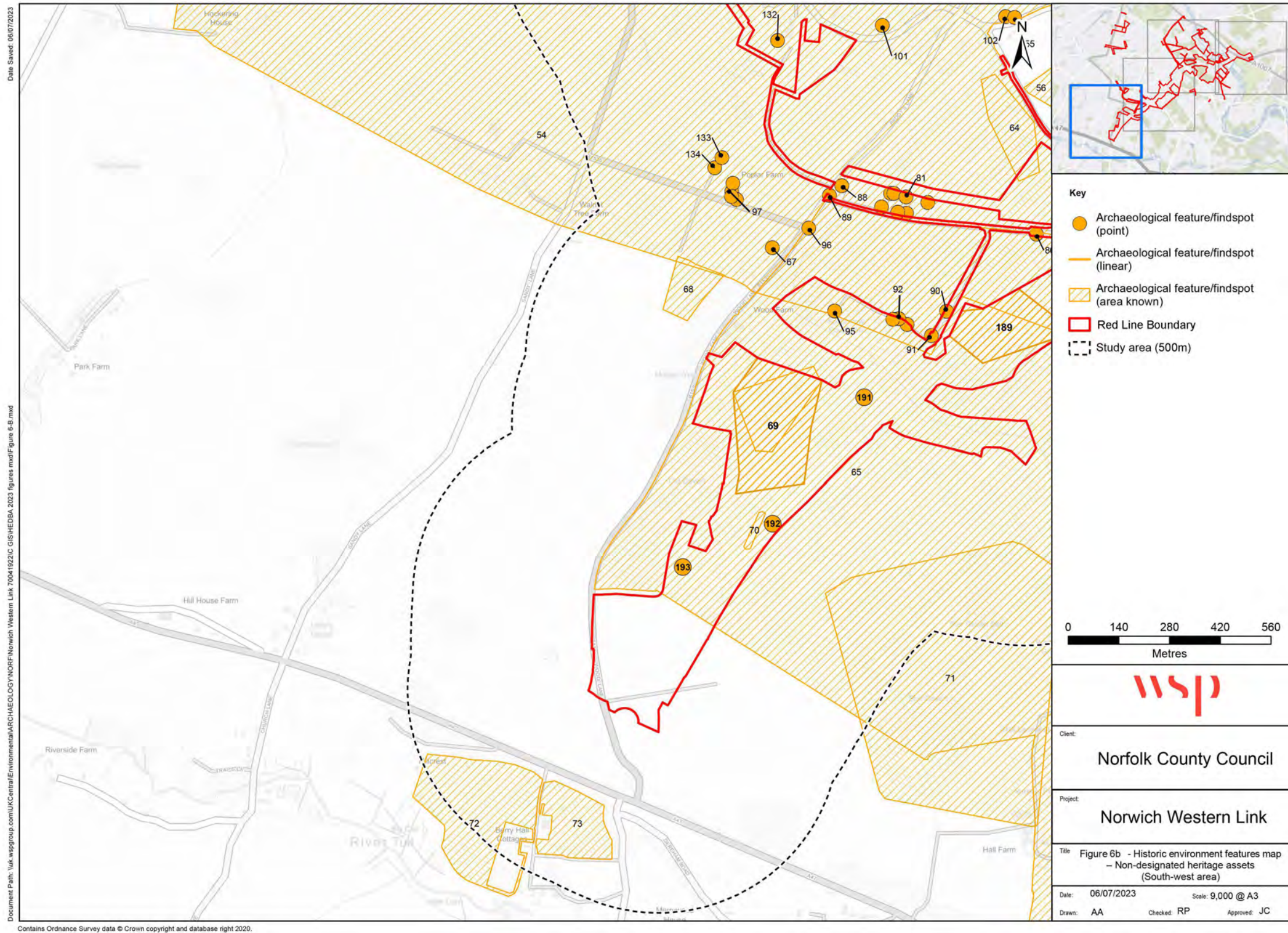


Figure 7 Geology map and borehole locations (British Geological Survey; Norfolk Partnership Laboratory 2019 to 2022 on the north-east part of the Red Line Boundary)

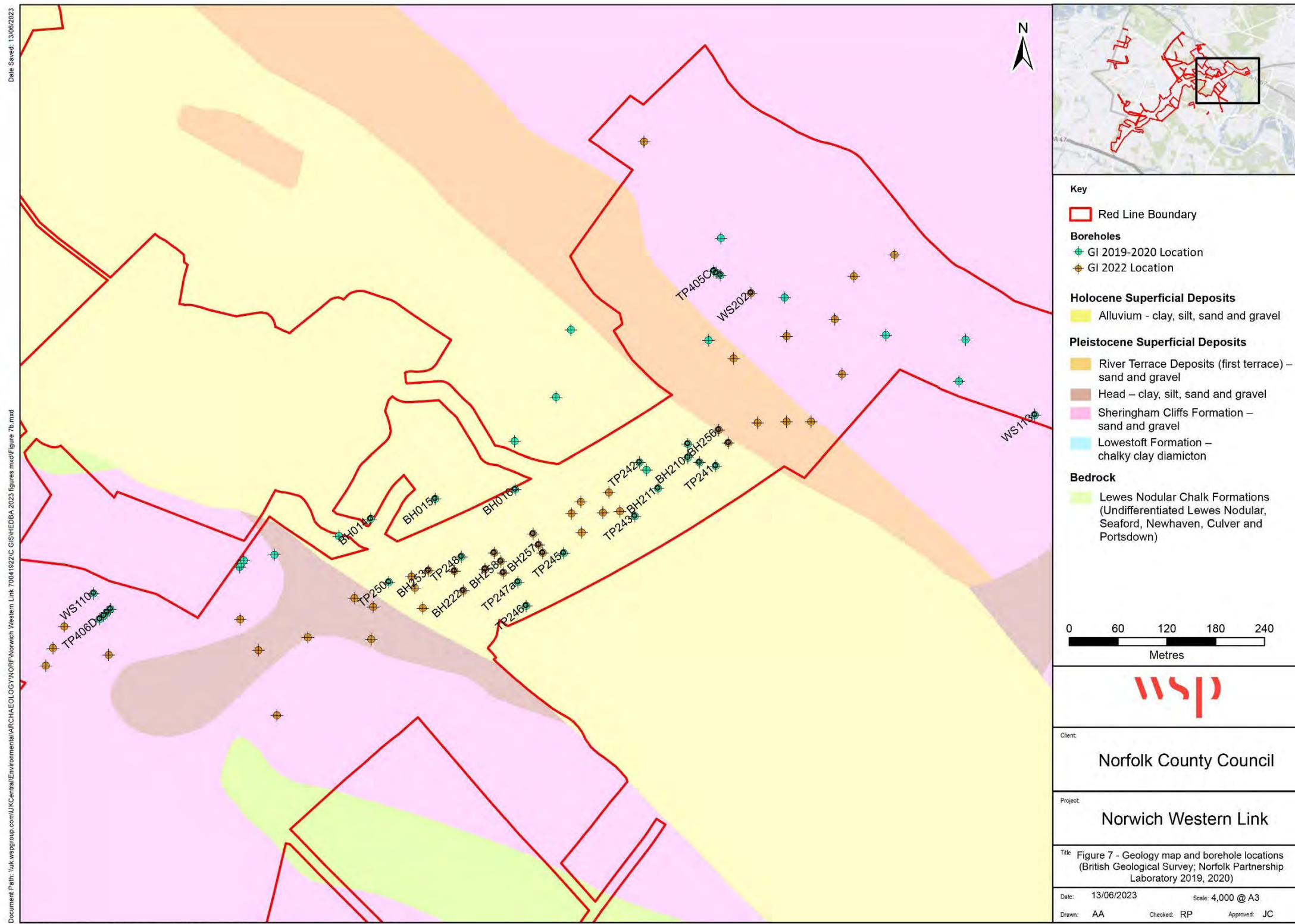


Figure 8 Areas of 2020–21 geophysical survey within the Red Line Boundary (Appendix 8.2 (Document Reference 3.08.02))

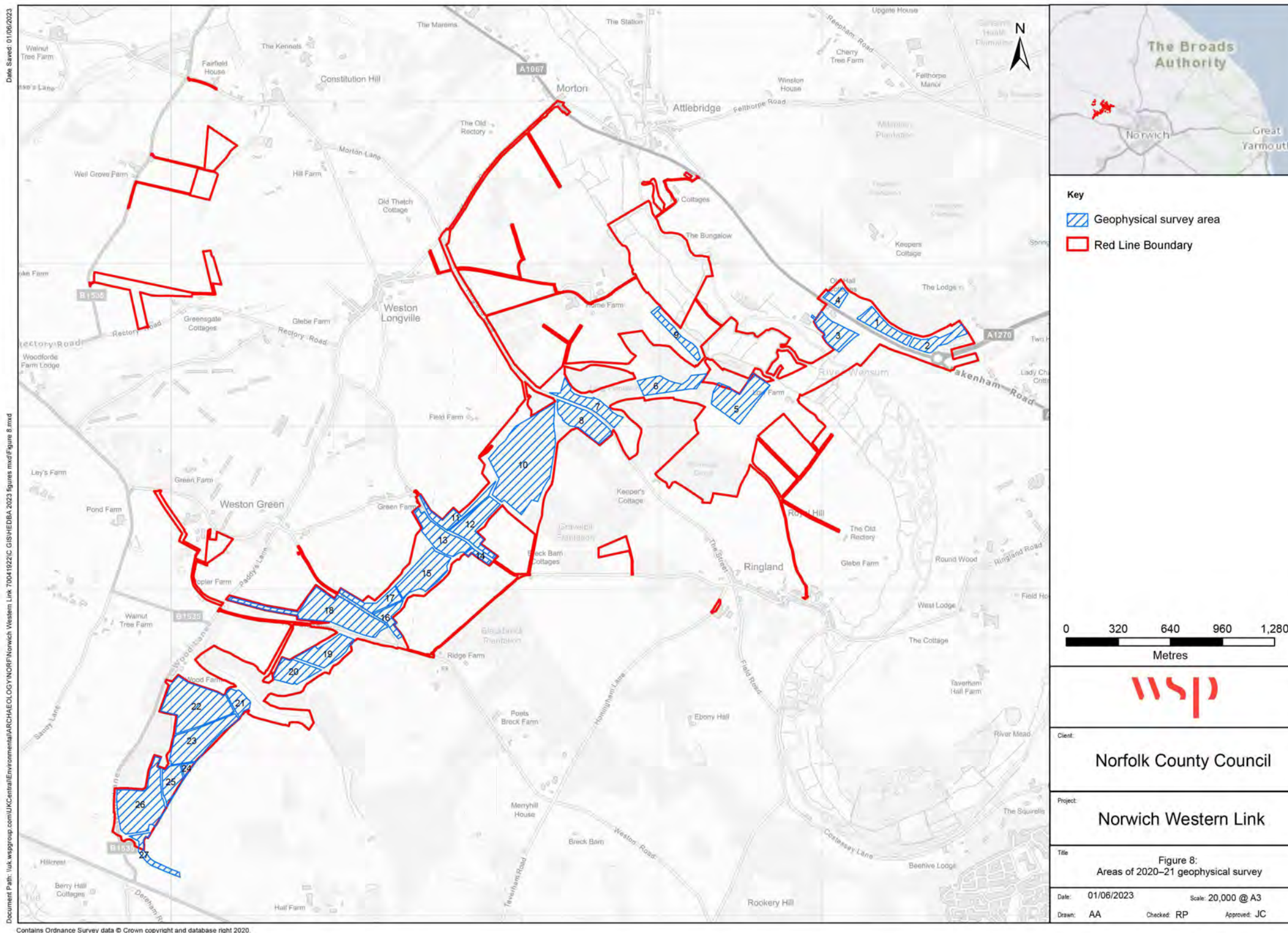


Figure 9 Faden’s map of Norfolk of 1797

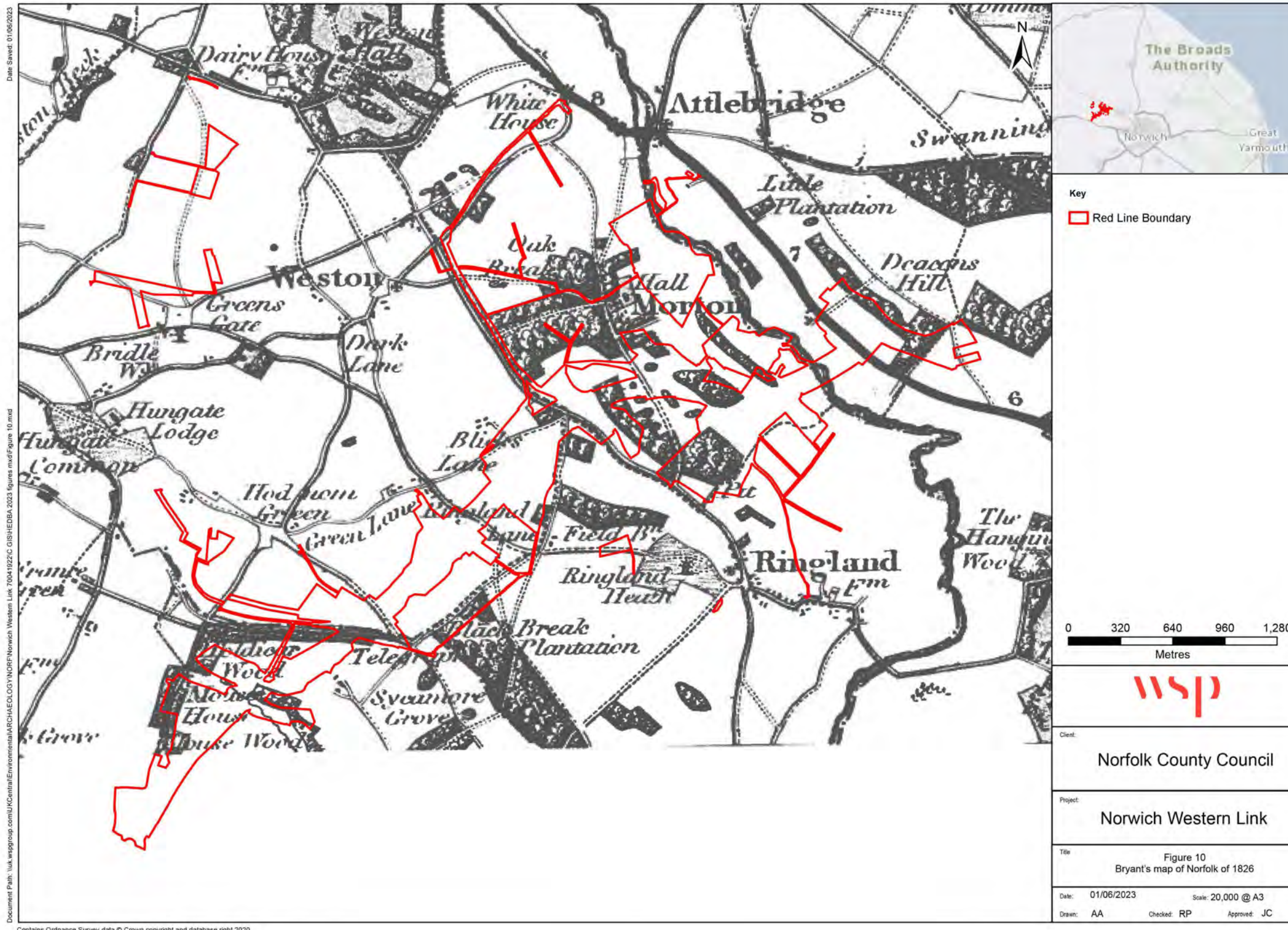


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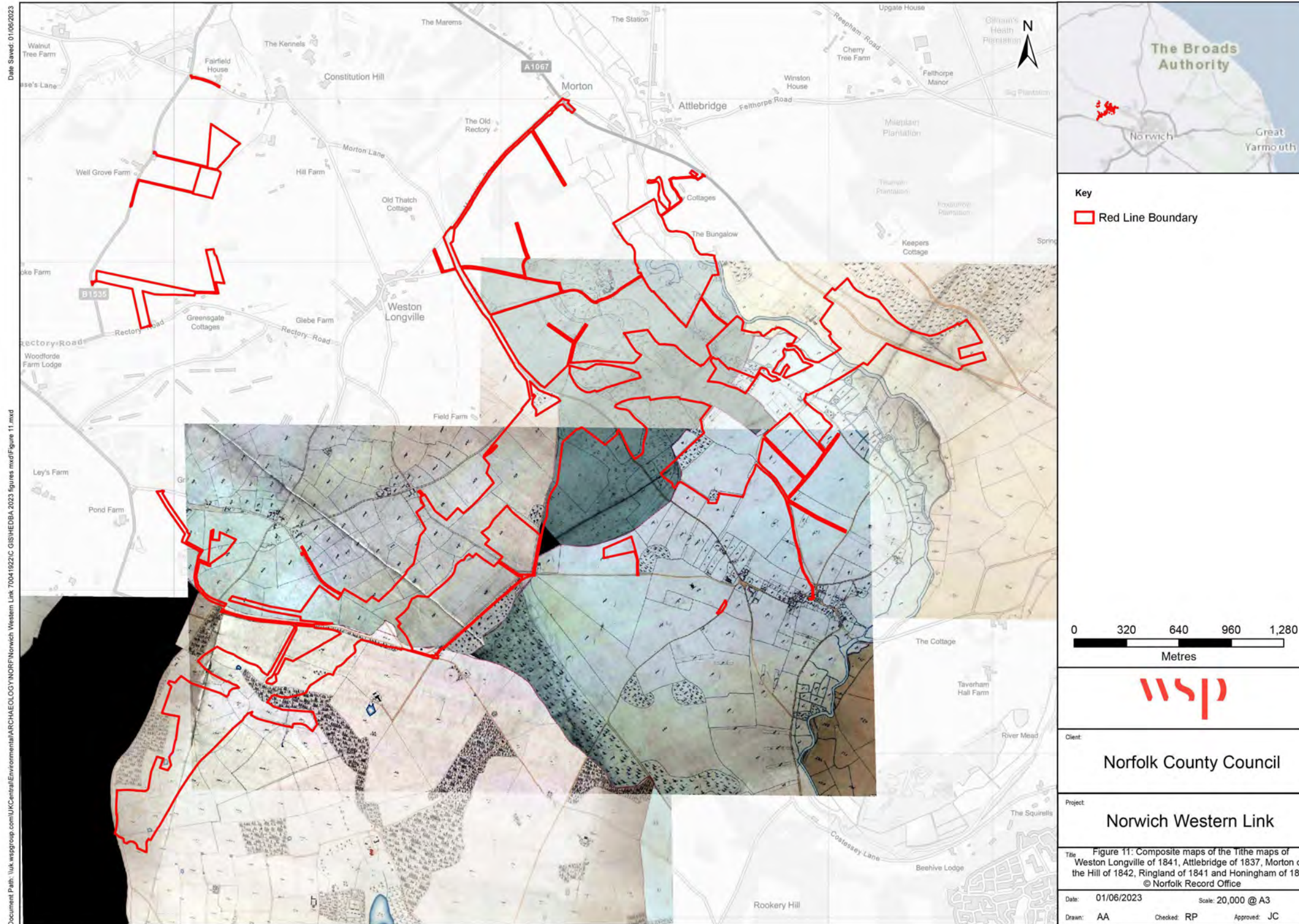


Figure 12 Ordnance Survey 1st edition 6": mile map of 1882 (North-eastern area) (not to scale)

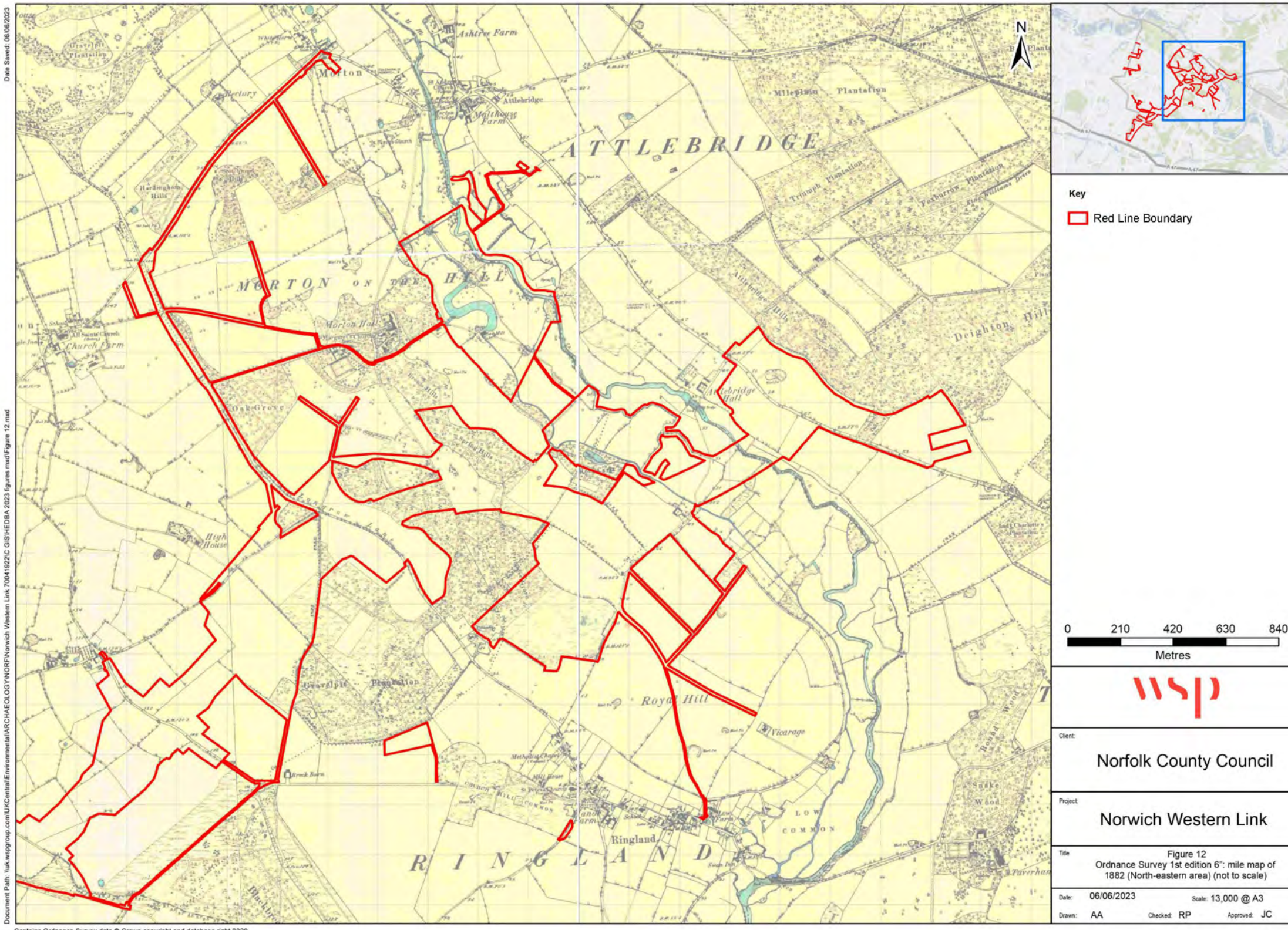


Figure 13 Ordnance Survey 1st edition 6": mile map of 1882 (South-western area) (not to scale)

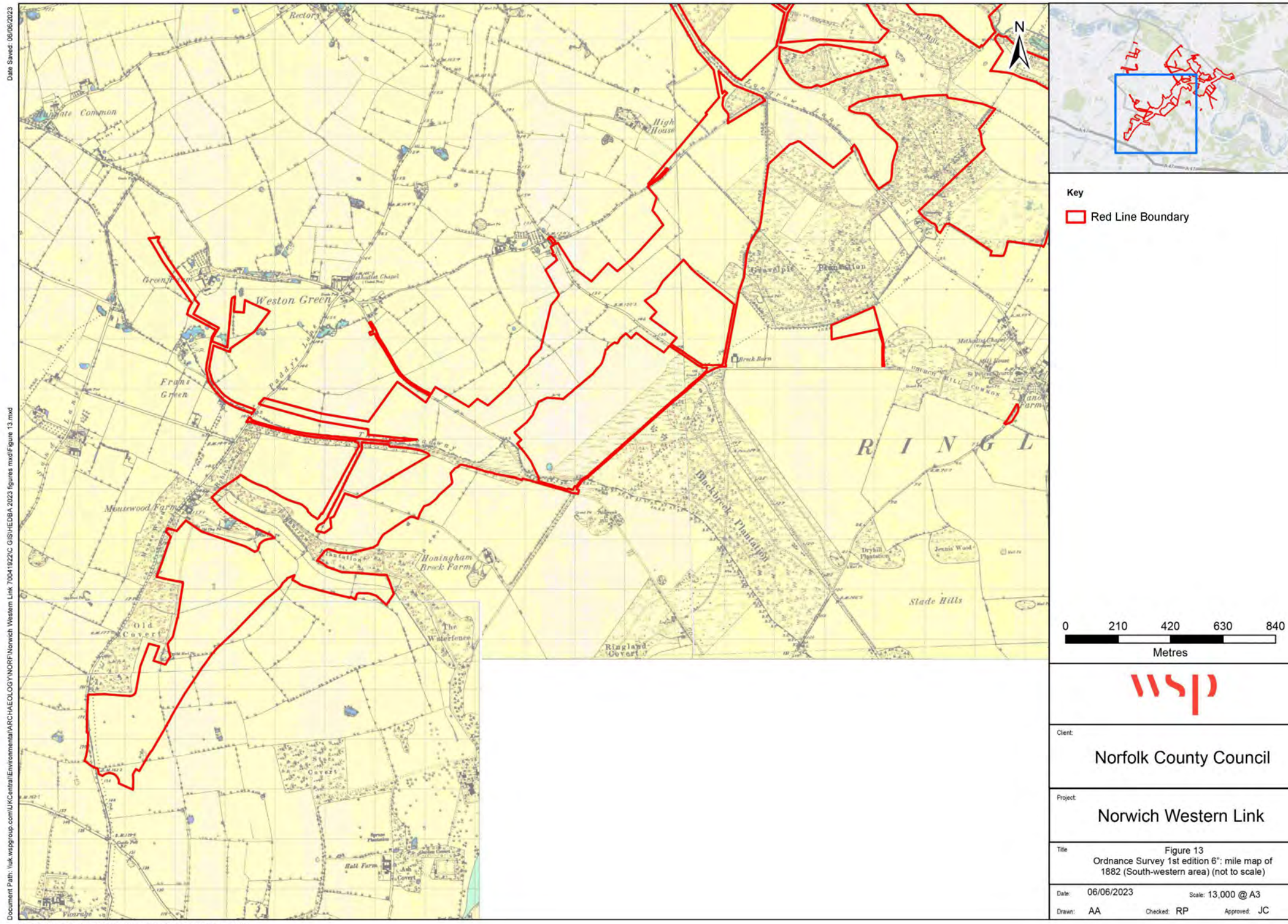


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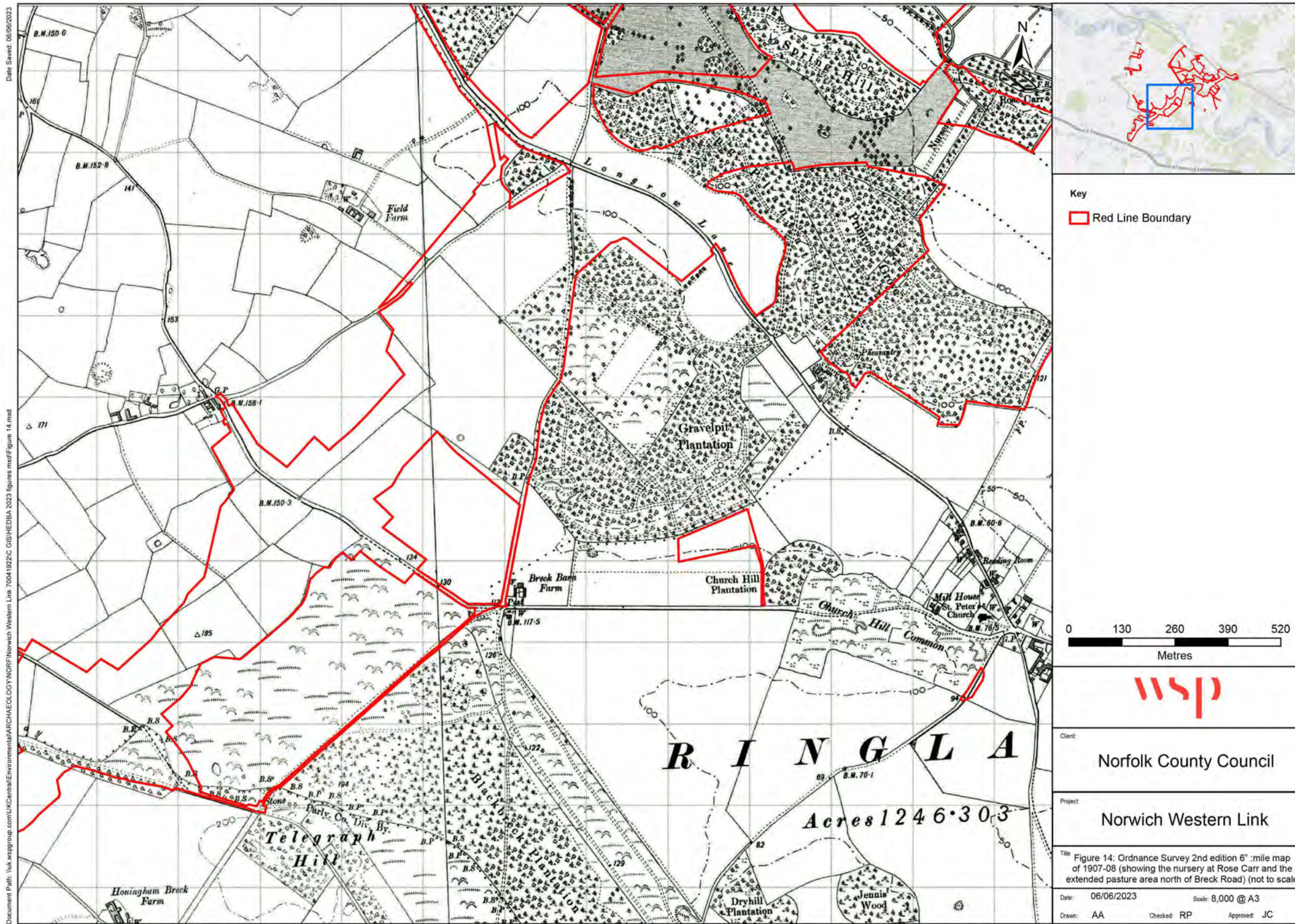


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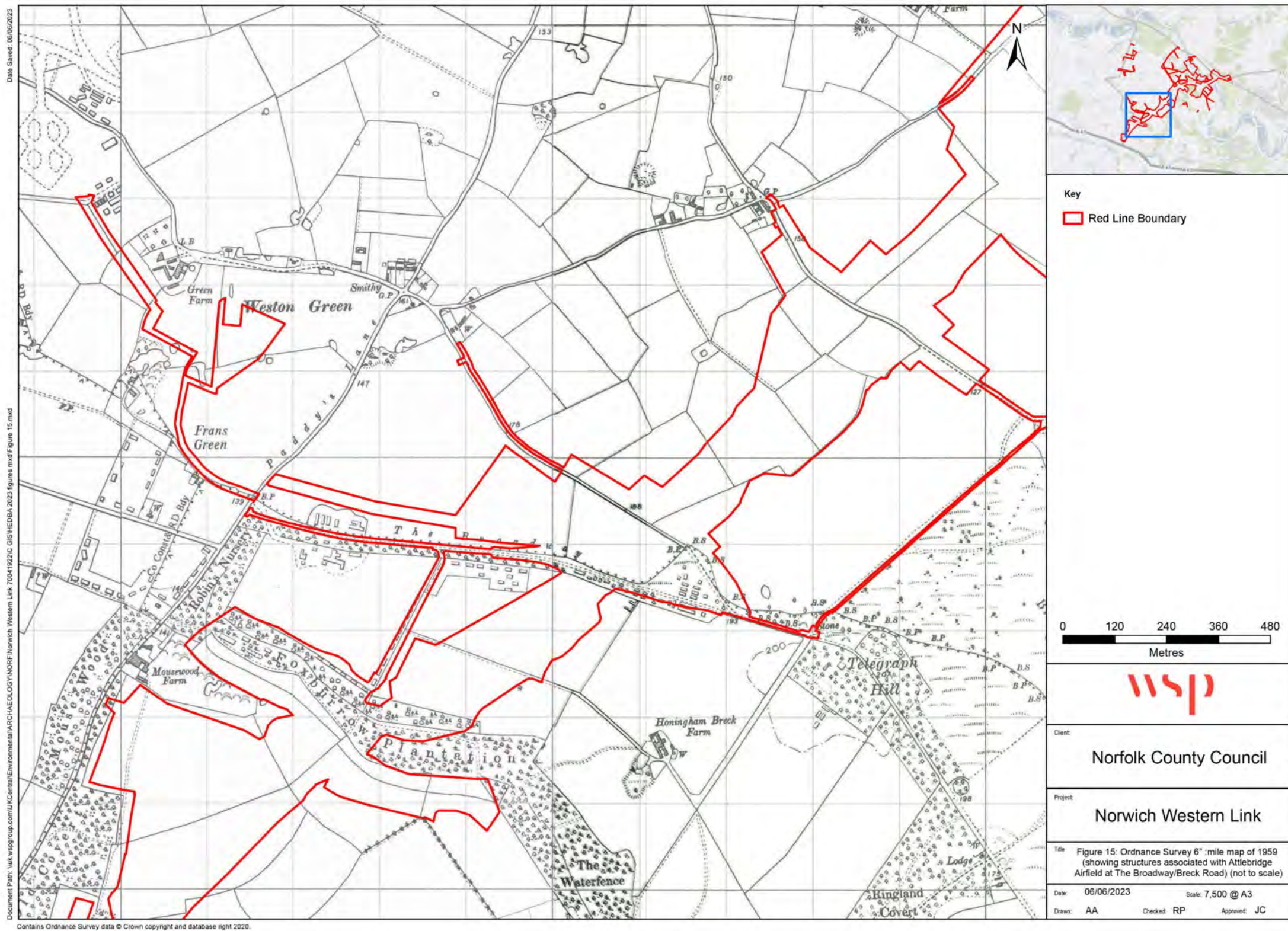


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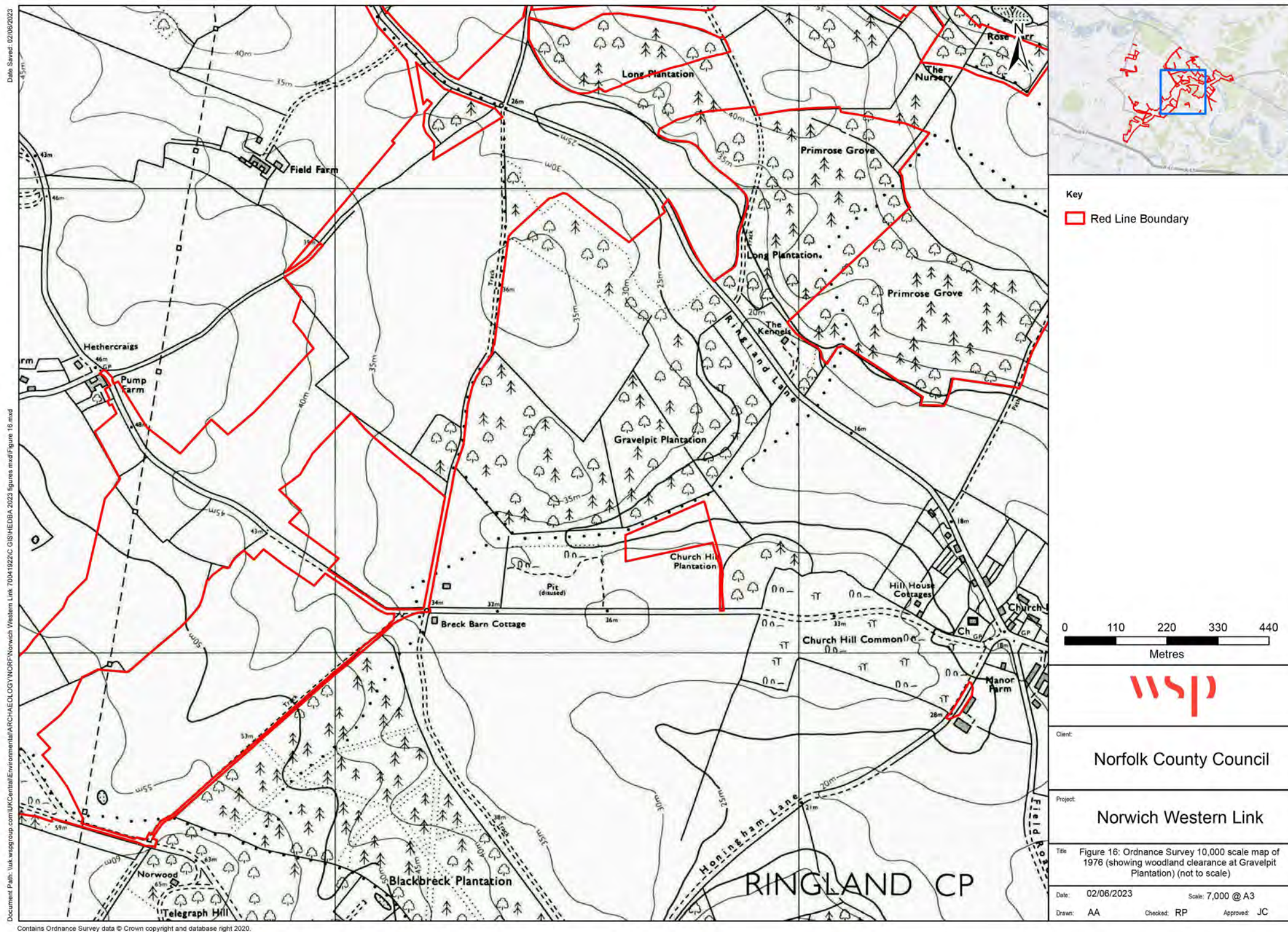


Figure 17 Historic Landscape Characterisation data in and around the Red Line Boundary

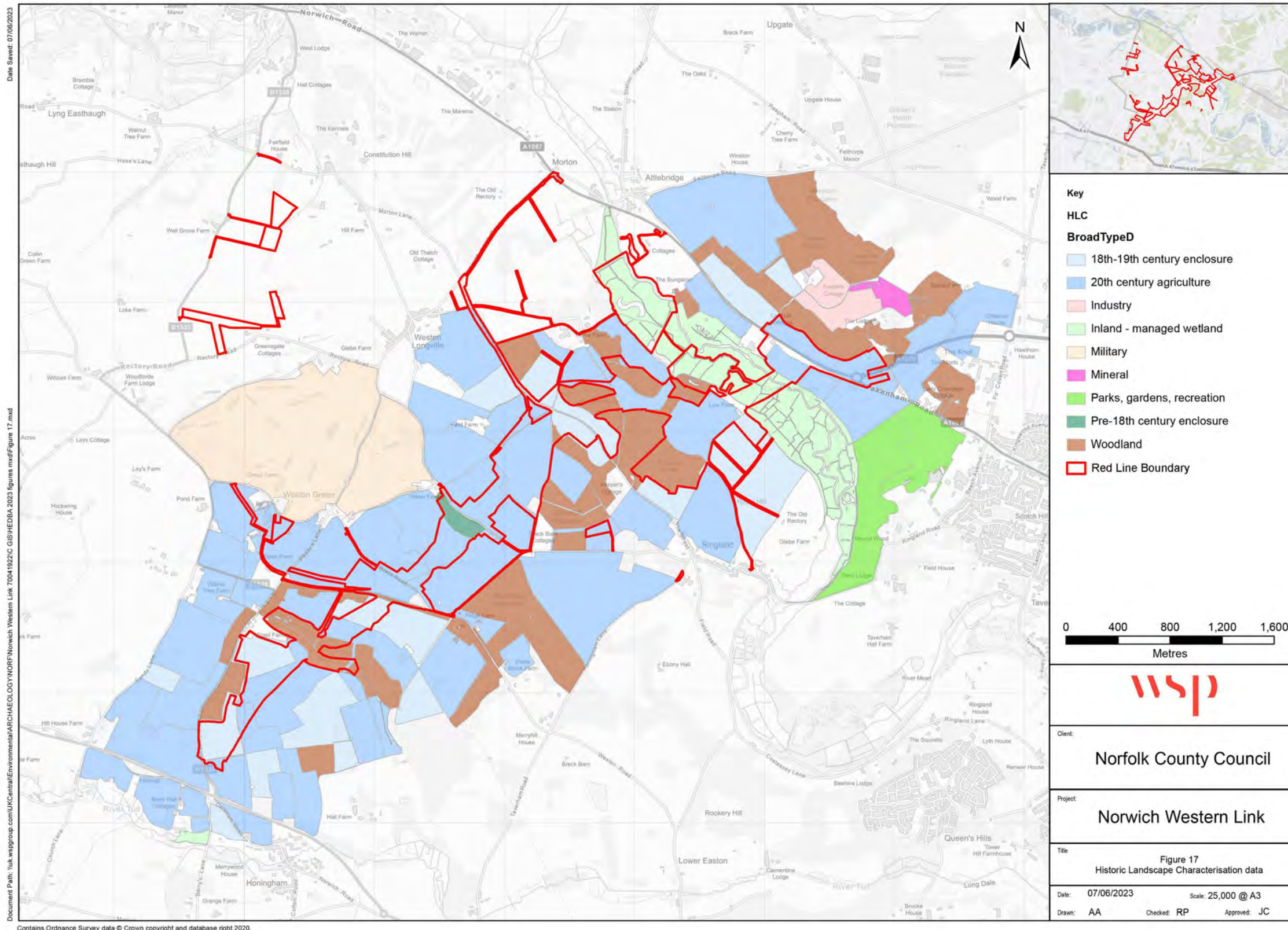


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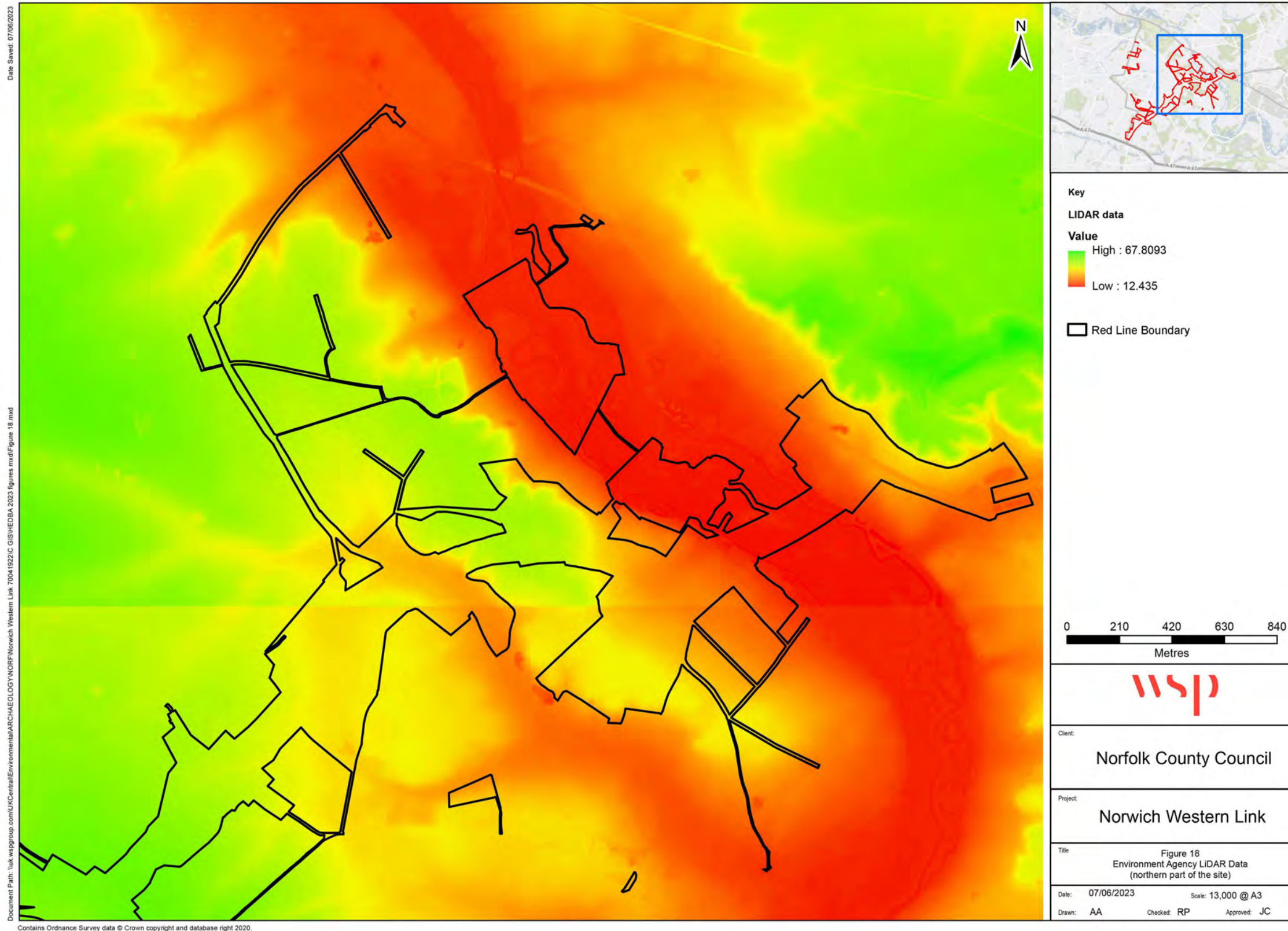
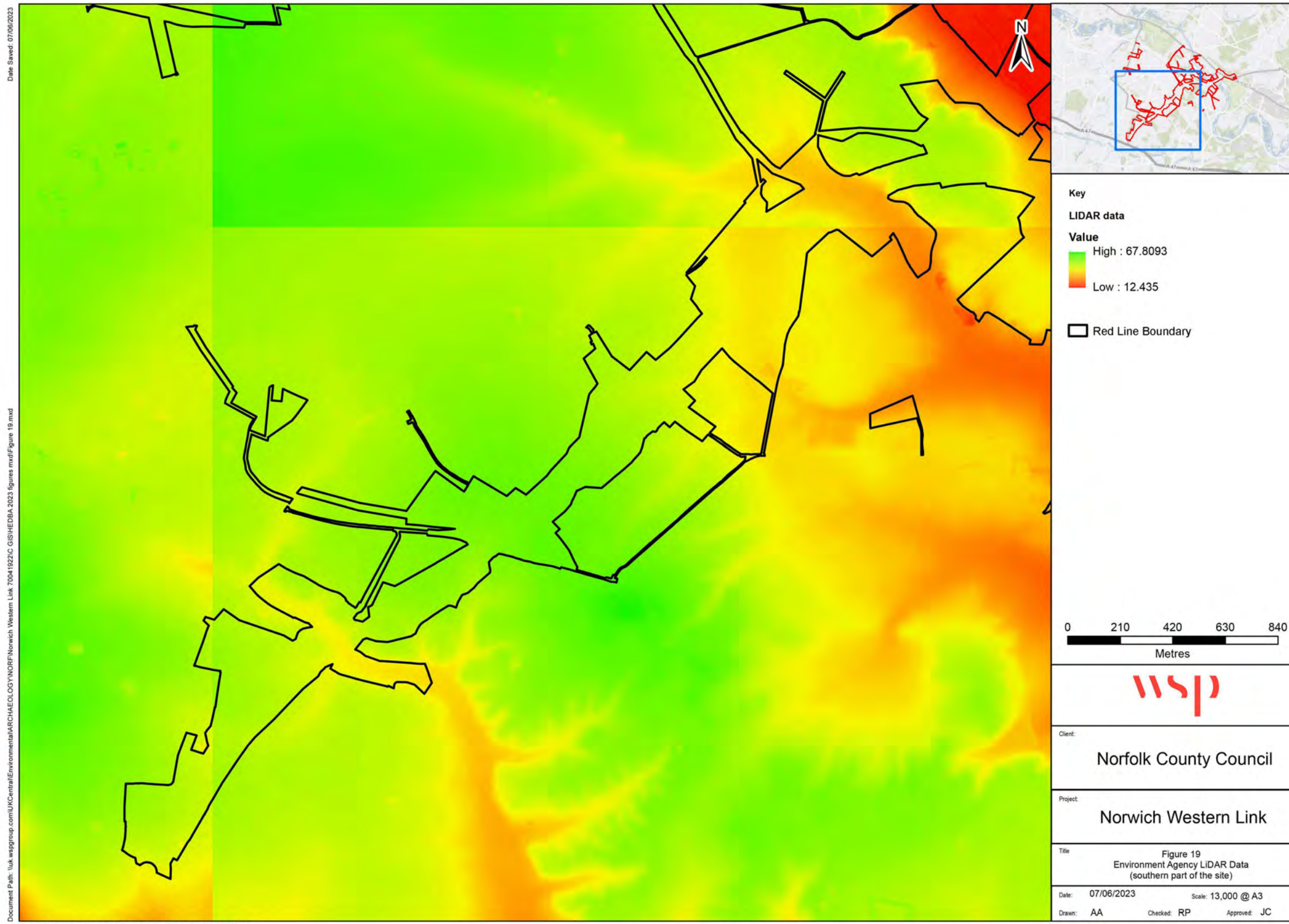


Figure 19 Environment Agency LiDAR Data within and around the southern part of the Red Line Boundary



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
